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Kevin O'Leary favoured for leader among card-carrying Conservatives

Peter MacKay preferred by all Canadians in total

TORONTO April 6th, 2016 In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll[™] among 1455 Canadian voters, the plurality among those with a choice for a leader see Peter MacKay as the best leader of the Conservative Party (18%), followed by those who opt for TV personality Kevin O'Leary (14%), who is in turn followed by current interim leader Rona Ambrose (10%). The list is rounded out by Maxime Bernier (9%), Jason Kenney and Lisa Raitt (6% each) and Dr. Kellie Leitch (2%). The largest single group thinks someone else not listed would make the best leader for the Conservatives (35%).

Among Conservative voters, however, Kevin O'Leary is very slightly preferred to MacKay (24% to 22%) while Rona Ambrose is third (17%). Among Conservatives, about one fifth prefer someone not listed (19%).

Finally, among those who are card-carrying members of the Conservative Party (and therefore will actually choose the leader), Kevin O'Leary is widely preferred to MacKay (28% to 20%) and no other listed candidate breaks double digits in preference. Among this select group, one quarter will support a candidate not listed here (24%).

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Methodology

The Forum Poll[™] was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1455 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age or older. The poll was conducted on between April 4th and April 5th, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at <u>www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp</u>

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.
