Cumming leads for Conservatives in Edmonton Centre

Liberals' Boissonault, NDP's McGowan tied in 2nd

TORONTO September 24th, 2015 - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll[™] among 524 voters in the newly distributed federal riding of Edmonton Centre, 4-in-10 will vote for the Conservative candidate, James Cumming (40%), while about 3-in-10 or just fewer will vote NDP (Gil McGowan - 30%) or Liberal (Randy Boissonault - 27%). Few will vote Green (4%).

"This riding was held, in its former incarnation, by Laurie Hawn, who was well-liked by members of all the parties. It appears his legacy is helping the Conservative candidate in this seat," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

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TORONTO September 24th, 2015 HIGHLIGHTS:

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Methodology

The Forum Poll[™] was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 525 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age or older. The poll was conducted from September 21st to 23rd, 2015.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 5%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at <u>www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp</u>

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
