Canada Should Protect Great Lakes if US Won't

Toronto, April 26th – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ amongst 1479 Canadian voters, a solid majority (57%) believe that if the United States cuts funding to the protection of the great lakes, that Canada has a responsibility to increase great lakes funding in response. Only (23%) say no, Canada does not have a responsibility to increase funding, with (20%) saying they don't know.

Respondents most likely to say that Canada has a responsibility to increase great lakes funding includes those aged 34 and younger (61%), the least wealthy (63%) or earning \$80,000-\$100,000 (63%), living in Ontario (62%) or BC (60%), and supporting the Green Party (70%). Those with a post-graduate (61%) or college/university degree (59%) are also likely to believe Canada has a responsibility to increase great lakes funding should the United States cut the funding for their protection.

Respondents most likely to say that Canada does not have a responsibility to increase great lakes funding includes those aged 45-54 (28%), males (30%), the most wealthy (32%), living in Manitoba/Saskatchewan (29%) or Alberta (29%), and supporting the Conservatives (36%). Those with some college or university (26%) are also likely to believe Canada does not have a responsibility to increase great lakes funding if the United States cuts it.

"Canadians clearly place great importance on the health of the great lakes, as a solid majority believe that we have a responsibility to increase our funding to protection if the US cuts theirs, and, given the current political climate in the United States, Canada may be in this situation more often than not in the coming months," said Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research.

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Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1479 randomly selected Canadian Voters. The poll was conducted on April 21-24, 2017.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
