### Two Thirds Want Marathons, etc., Off City Streets

### Most approve of holding marches, parades and marathons in city parks

In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 757 Toronto voters, two thirds approve of holding marathons, marches, walkathons and festivals in city parks rather than closing city streets (68%), while just one fifth disapprove of this solution (20%). Disapproval of restricting these activities to parks is common to the less wealthy (23%), in the downtown (25%) and East York (30%), those with children (23%), the best educated (post grad - 26%), Olivia Chow voters (34%) and among those who commute by bike or walk (47% and 30%, respectively: caution - small base sizes). In contrast, when we last asked this two years ago, fewer wanted marathons held in parks (July, 2014 - 55%) whil one quarter disapproved (24%).

"Torontonians support these activities, most of which benefit charity, I'm sure, but they don't see the need to impede public travel to accommodate them. Furthermore, they are less patient now than two years ago" said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

### **HIGHLIGHTS:**

### Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 757 randomly selected Toronto voters. The poll was conducted on October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 4%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at <a href="https://www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp">www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp</a>

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
