## Plurality approves of basic income

#### Popular among young, least wealthy

TORONTO March 26<sup>th</sup> - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll<sup>™</sup> among 1225 Ontario voters, the plurality, 4-in-10, approve of an Ontario basic income to replace social assistance and other provincial support payments (41%). One third disapprove of the idea (33%) and as many as a quarter have no opinion (26%).

### Idea popular among young and less wealthy

The idea of a basic income receives its strongest support from the youngest (52%), the least wealthy (often a proxy for youth - 58%), in Eastern Ontario (46%), among Liberals especially (59%) as well as New Democrats (46%), but not among PCs (21%).

"This appears to be an idea whose appeal is growing. We have polled a similar question federally in 2012, and just one quarter approved," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

## HIGHLIGHTS:

- The plurality, 4-in-10, approves of an Ontario basic income to replace social assistance and other provincial support payments (41%).

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### Methodology

The Forum Poll<sup>™</sup> was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1225 randomly selected Ontarians 18 years of age and older. The poll was conducted March 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at <a href="http://www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp">www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp</a>

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
