#### Liberal lead cut to 23 points

#### Progressive Conservatives, NDP increase vote share

TORONTO November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015 - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll<sup>™</sup> among 842 Newfoundland and Labrador voters, just more than half will vote Liberal (52%), while about 3-in-10 will vote Progressive Conservative (29%). The NDP vote is characteristic of one fifth (19%). This stands in sharp contrast to the last time we polled the day after the writs were drawn up, when the Liberals had a 44 point lead (November 6 - Liberals 65% to 21% for the Progressive Conservatives, 13% for the NDP).

The Liberal vote is common to the younger voter (35 to 44 - 59%), the least wealthy (65%), western Newfoundland and Corner Brook (67%) and among those voting in advance polls (62%).

The Progressive Conservative vote is characteristic of the oldest (33%), mid-income groups (\$40K to \$60K - 40%), in St John's and the Avalon Peninsula (31%), but not in Labrador (22%).

The NDP vote is common to the youngest (31%) and in Labrador (46%).

Of note, about 4-in-10 past Progressive Conservative voters will support the Liberals this time (39%), as will the same proportion of past NDP voters (41%).

#### Leader approvals are stable

Close to half approve of Dwight Ball (45%) and his net favourable rating (approve minus disapprove) is +12, Paul Davis has the approval of 4-in-10 (39%) and his net is a slightly negative -5. Earle McCurdy is approved of by 3-in-10 (30%) and his net score is a negative -16.

#### Ball seen as best premier

Dwight Ball is seen as the best Premier by a slight margin over Paul Davis (34% to 30%) while Earle McCurdy does not pass muster on this measure (10%).

"It appears that reports of the Liberals' massive lead in some polls has led voters to reconsider their decision, with just 6 days left until the election. Make no mistake, the Liberals still sport a huge lead, but probably not enough for a legislative sweep," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

#### Methodology

The Forum Poll<sup>™</sup> was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 842 randomly selected Newfoundland and Labrador voters. The poll was conducted on November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2015.

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Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Electoral outcome depends on the success of the parties at getting out the vote. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
