Voters Favour Wind Farms, Offshore and on Land

High support for public investment in alternative energy

TORONTO November 23rd – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1184 Ontario voters, one half favour rural wind farms (54%) and a similar proportion favour offshore wind farms (52%). In each case, 3-in-10 or fewer disapprove (30% and 26%, respectively). Between one sixth and one fifth don't have an opinion (15% and 22%, respectively).

Two thirds support public investment in alternative energy

Two thirds of voters support investing public funds in developing alternative energy sources like wind, solar and geothermal (65%), and this is especially common to the youngest (77%), the least wealthy (70%), in the city of Toronto (71%), among Liberals (87%) and New Democrats (77%) and the best educated (post grad - 70%). Fewer than one quarter oppose this kind of public investment (22%) and about one tenth don't have an opinion (13%). Opposition is characteristic of the middle aged (45 to 64 - 28%), males (28%) rather than females (15%), the wealthy (\$80K to \$100K - 27%), in Eastern Ontario (28%), among PC supporters (40%) especially and among the least educated (secondary school or less - 26%).

Most believe alternative energy sources will be sufficient in future

The plurality of voters (44%) believe alternative energy sources like wind, solar and geothermal will be sufficient to replace oil, gas and coal in the future, while just 3-in-10 don't believe this to be the case (30%) and one quarter don't know if it is or not (25%). Belief in the future of alternative fuels sources is strongest among the youngest, the least wealthy, in Northern Ontario and among Liberals.

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Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1184 randomly selected Ontario voters. The poll was conducted on November 21st, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
