## UNITED CONSERVATIVE MAJORITY

Toronto, April $16^{\text {th }}$ - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ among 1140 Alberta voters, amongst those decided and leaning half of Albertans (50.6\%) say that they would support the United Conservative Party.
A third (34.6\%) say they would support the NDP and about 1 in 10 (10.9\%) would support the Alberta Party.

Few say they would support either the Liberals (2.2\%) or another party (1.7\%).

## United Conservative majority, NDP as opposition

We project that the United Conservative Party will secure a majority of 67 seats, the NDP will serve as opposition with 19 seats, and the Alberta Party will win 1.
"The lead held by the United Conservative Party over the governing NDP will prove unshakeable, and Jason Kenney will secure a majority government," said Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research.

## Methodology

The Forum Poll ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1140 randomly selected Albertans. 121,730 Albertans were contacted to participate. This poll was not sponsored by a third party and was conducted on April $15^{\text {th }}, 2019$.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/-3\%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Actual results depend on a Candidate's ability to get their voters out. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
