Strong Approval For Yonge Street Renewal

Drivers less enthusiastic than cyclists, pedestrians

In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 868 Toronto voters, the clear majority, about two thirds, approve of the plan to renew Yonge Street from Queen Street north to Davenport Road (64%). It is explained the renewal will involve widened sidewalks, planters and reduction of Yonge Street to two lanes. Just more than a quarter disapprove of the plan (28%), and one tenth don't share an opinion (9%).

Enthusiasm for the project is common to all demographic groups across the city with the exception of those who voted for Doug Ford (44%), those who commute by car (55%) and those in Etobicoke (53%). Enthusiasm is high in the old city of Toronto, within whose boundaries the renewal will take place (70%), as well as among the least wealthy (79%), in the old city of York (77%), cyclists (84%), walkers (77%) and those who take transit (74%) and, finally, those who voted Olivia Chow in the last mayoral election (81%).

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 868 randomly selected Toronto adults. The poll was conducted on July 18th, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
