Tory Continues to Lead

Tory's approval unchanged

Toronto, October 15th – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll[™] among 1206 Toronto voters, amongst those decided and leaning, Tory sees support from more than half of voters (56%) unchanged since the beginning of this month (October 3: 56%).

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Keesmaat sees support from almost one-third (29%) unchanged from the beginning of this month (October 3: 29%).

The other candidates see support from about one-sixth (15%).

Tory's approval down slightly

Tory's approval (54%) down two points since the beginning of October (October 10: 56%) and his disapproval (30%) is unchanged (October 10: 30%).

One-sixth (16%) say they do not know.

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Methodology

The Forum Poll[™] was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1206 randomly selected Toronto Voters. The poll was conducted on October 9th− 10th, 2018.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at <u>www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp</u>

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Actual results depend on a Candidate's ability to get their voters out. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
