Liberals and NDP tied in Sudbury

Thibeault with high awareness, Olivier and Shawbonquit with highest approvals

TORONTO January 13th, 2015 - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 801 voters in the Ontario provincial riding of Sudbury, where a by-election will take place February 5th, relatively equal proportions of voters, about 4-in-10, will vote either for the Liberal candidate and former NDP MP, Glenn Thibeault (40%) or the NDP candidate, Suzanne Shawbonquit (42%). About one tenth will vote Paula Peroni, the PC candidate (13%) and very few will vote either the Green candidate, David Robinson (3%) or the former Liberal, now independent candidate, Andrew Olivier (1%).

Thibeault with highest awareness, Olivier and Shawbonquit have best approvals

While Glenn Thibeault is the best known candidate (96% aware), his approval is characteristic of just one half (51%), greater than that for Paula Peroni (aware - 74%, approve - 37%), but less than that for less well-known candidates (Suzanne Shawbonquit, aware - 67%, approve - 68% and Andrew Olivier, aware 83%, approve - 68%). Thibeault's approvals are, in fact, equal to those of the least known candidate, David Robinson of the Green Party (aware - 32%, approve 51%).

"Despite Glenn Thibeault's high profile in this riding as the former NDP MP, it is shaping up to be a horserace between him and Suzanne Shawbonquit, the new NDP candidate, and this is helped along by the deep New Democrat roots in this riding," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

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TORONTO June 13th, 2015 HIGHLIGHTS:

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 801 randomly selected residents of the Sudbury provincial riding 18 years of age and older. The poll was conducted on January 13th, 2015.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Actual results will depend on the parties' success at getting their voters out. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
