Half Favour Closer Ties with China

Support highest among Liberals, oldest, wealthiest

In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1370 Canadian voters, one half favour developing closer ties with China (50%), while one quarter oppose the idea (26%). A similar proportion have no opinion (24%).

Opposition to closer ties with China is common to Gen X (45 to 54 - 31%), mid income groups (\$40K to \$60K - 33%), those in Ontario (30%) and BC (32%), Conservatives (35%) and mothers (30%).

Support for a China strategy is high among the oldest (65+ - 56%), males (59%), the wealthiest (59%), Maritimers (57%), Albertans (56%), Liberals (64%) and the best educated (post grad - 55%).

"Prime Minister Trudeau's China play is well-liked by Liberals, but also by wealthy males and the oldest, who are traditionally Conservative. This appears to be an excellent example of a policy in which common sense displaces partisan fervor" said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

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Methodology

The Forum Poll^m was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1370 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age or older. The poll was conducted on September 6^{th} and 7^{th} , 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
