Tory Holds Majority Support in Upcoming Election

Tory continues his lead, cost of living cited as biggest issue

Toronto, October 11th – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 1017 Torontonian voters, amongst those decided and leaning, over half (56%) support John Tory.

Runners up is Gil Penalosa, holding 20% of support. Chloe-Marie Brown and Blake Acton each hold 6%, and 12% support another candidate.

"Tory continues to hold a majority lead with the election only two weeks away," said Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research. "It's very unlikely we would see anything but a Tory victory at this point."

The cost of living and inflation (25%) and housing affordability (21%) were cited as the top two issues of major concern. Traffic, congestion and transit followed in third place with 13% of respondents choosing it as their top issue.

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1017 randomly selected eligible voters across Toronto. The poll was conducted from October 7th – October 8th, 2022. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20.
