Kevin O'Leary Still Preferred by Conservatives for Leader

MacKay and Ambrose also place

TORONTO May 13th, 2016 - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1517 Canadian voters, those who will vote Conservative if an election were held today are most likely to select reality TV star Kevin O'Leary as the best choice for party leader (27%), followed closely by former serial cabinet minister Peter MacKay (23%). Somewhat fewer opt for current interim leader Rona Ambrose (16%). Maxime Bernier and Jason Kenney are the choice of fewer than a tenth of party voters (6% each), and few opt for Kellie Leitch (3%) or Lisa Raitt (2%).

Among the entire population of voters, Peter MacKay is preferred (18%) to O'Leary (14%) or Ambrose (11%). The largest single group of voters says someone else should have the job (35%).

Among our very small sample of those who claim to be Conservative Party members, O'Leary is even more strongly preferred (23%) to MacKay (16%) or to Bernier (11%) or Ambrose (12%).

Since we polled this question last month, enthusiasm for Mr O'Leary has grown among Conservative voters (April 6 O'Leary - 24%, MacKay - 22%.), while among members, enthusiasm for the erstwhile Dragon has diminished (O'Leary - 28%, MacKay - 20%).

"The Conservatives want to pick a winner, and it looks like they think Kevin O'Leary may be their chicken dinner. He's at least competitive among voters at large, and the closer you get to the Conservative heart, the more popular he is," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1517 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age or older. The poll was conducted on May 10th and May 11th, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
