PATIENT EXPERIENCE

The majority of patients or family members are finding their visits to their local hospital to be a helpful, and positive experience. At the heart of it, people feel strongly about the care they're receiving, as well as the way they're receiving it.

OVERALL EXPERIENCE







Age: experience satisfaction increases as age increases, with those 65 and older being far more likely to be pleased with their experience than other age categories

HELPFULLNESS OF THE VISIT







Age: the feeling of visit helpfulness, like experience satisfaction, increases with age, with those 65 and over responding most positively



FUNDRAISING

While the majority have not donated to their local hospital, most say that they would be likely to do so in the future.

DONATION ABILITY AWARENESS

Age: respondents over the age of 55 are most aware of the ability to make a donation to a hospital.

Education: residents with a college/university degree are most aware of hospital donations

FUTURE DONATION LIKELIHOOD







Region: most respondents in Southwestern Ontario would be at least somewhat likely to donate in the future Education: residents with some college/university, or a completed college/university degree are most likely to say they'd donate in the future

PERSONAL DONATION HISTORY







Region: Eastern Ontario is the most generous

HEALTHCARE RATINGS

When it comes to the quality of care, the largest category of respondents rated the healthcare received as **excellent**, and almost three quarters rated the care as **good** or better.





Better experience means more support for Ontario hospitals

Ontarians who rated their health care experience as **good**, **very good**, **or excellent** were more likely to **donate to their local hospital in the future**.



GOVERNMENT FUNDING

You don't need a neurosurgeon to tell you that healthcare system doesn't get the funding it needs to fully operate. You know it, we know it...but the good news is, most Ontarians know it too. In better news, more than three quarters know that the reason hospitals fundraise is to support equipment and initiatives not paid for by the government. Additionally, more than two-thirds think the government should increase its funding to hospitals, which provides a very broad base of support for a campaign to increase base funding.

OVERALL SATISFACTION

Ontarians are pretty happy with the healthcare system.

Happy patients mean giving patients, with more than 8 in 10 that said they were somewhat satisfied or very satisfied also said they would be very likely to donate to their local hospital in the future.

Ultimately, Ontario's healthcare system gets a clean bill of health from its patients and they're likely to recommend it to their friends and family.




Respondents in Eastern Ontario are far more likely to recommend their local hospital, with 81% saying they would at least "probably" recommend it.
