Two Thirds Want Interest-Free Student Loans

Agreement with interest-free loans until paid

In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1124 Ontario voters, two thirds agree that provincial student loans should remain interest free, not just as long as the student is in school, but until they are paid, whenever that may be (66%). Just one quarter do not approve of this idea (25%) and a tenth have no opinion (9%).

Agreement with the idea is especially common to the youngest (73%) but not the oldest (54%), with females (70%) rather than males (38%), among the less wealthy (\$20K to \$40K - 77%), among mothers (77%) and among New Democrats (81%).

Opposition is common to boomers (55 to 64 - 31%), the wealthiest (\$100K to \$250K - 37%), in Toronto (30%), among PCs (38%) and the best educated (post grad - 30%).

"It is interesting to see that those who agree the least with this idea, the oldest and wealthiest, are those least likely to need it" said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1124 randomly selected Ontario adults. The poll was conducted on October 17-18th, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
