Two-thirds Think the Government Should Do More to Counter Opioid Addiction

Toronto, March 3rd— In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 1,061 British Columbia voters, the majority (63%) say that the government should do more to counter addiction to opioids the province of which (51%) say it should do more, and (12%) say the government should do a lot more. Just over a quarter (27%) believe the government has done enough to combat opioid addiction, while (11%) say they don't know.

Those most likely to say that the government should do more include respondents aged 34 and below (56%), are female (54%), the most wealthy (58%), and those that earn \$60,000-\$80,000 (58%). Those that live in Vancouver Lower Mainland (53%) and NDP supporters (63%) are also likely to hold the opinion that the government has not done enough to counter opioid addiction in the province.

Those most likely to say the government should do a lot more to counter opioid addiction are the least wealthy (20%).

Respondents most likely to say to say the government has done enough to counter opioid addiction include those aged 55-64 (33%), males (31%), those who completed some college or university (32%), and either Liberal (39%) or Conservative (39%) supporters.

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1,061 randomly selected British Columbia Voters. The poll was conducted on Feb 22-23 2017.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
