One Half Approve of Rail Deck Park

More than a third agree public financing may be used

TORONTO November 16th – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 778 Toronto voters, one half approve of the idea of the 21 acre Rail Deck Park downtown, despite being told it may cost \$1 billion to build (51%), while just fewer than 4-in-10 disapprove of the idea (38%). One tenth have no opinion (10%). Approval of the park is characteristic of the youngest (57%), males (55%) more than females (48%), the very wealthiest (59%), in the downtown (64%), among the best educated (post grad - 57%), bicycle commuters (76%), those who approve of John Tory (61%) and those who voted for him (59%). Disapproval is characteristic of the oldest (48%), mid income groups (\$40K to \$60K - 47%), in York (49%) and Scarborough (55%), among the least educated (secondary school or less - 49%) and those who voted for Doug Ford (74%).

More than a third approve of public financing for park

Just more than a third of Toronto voters agree public funds may be spent on this park (37%), while just less than half disagree (46%). Close to one fifth don't have an opinion (17%). Agreement with public funding is common to younger voters (35 to 44 - 43%), males (44%) rather than females (31%), the wealthiest (\$100K to \$250K - 51%), in the downtown (51%), but not in Scarborough (18%), among the best educated (post grad - 47%), bike commuters (74%) and Olivia Chow voters (56%), but not Doug Ford voters (18%).

Two thirds agree more downtown parkland needed

Two thirds of Toronto voters agree Toronto needs more parkland downtown (65%), fewer than a quarter disagree (22%) and just more than a tenth don't share their opinion (13%). Agreement more parkland is needed is especially strong, obviously, in the downtown (80%), but also in East York (78% - caution: small base size).

"This is a huge vote of confidence in this proposed park, in that voters were given the estimated cost when they were asked their approval. It is almost impossible to poll any expensive public works positively, but, in this case, there is such a recognized need for green space in the core that approval is high," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 778 randomly selected Toronto voters. The poll was conducted on November 14th, 2016.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 4%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
