### Saxe Slightly Ahead of Potts in University-Rosedale

Saxe leads slightly ahead of Potts, holding 38% of support

Toronto, Sept 15<sup>th</sup> – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 216 Ward 11 voters, amongst those decided and leaning, 38% support Dianne Saxe, and closely behind her is Robin Buxton Potts at 26%.

"With a lead of only 12%, this will very likely be a tight leadership race," says Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research. "Things could swing either way in these next few weeks."

John Tory maintains a strong lead with 53% of support.

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 216 randomly selected eligible voters across University-Rosedale. The poll was conducted on Sept 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 7%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample and regional results will be less accurate.
