Nunziata Maintains Strong Lead in Ward 5

Nunziata expected to get re-elected in York South-Weston

Toronto, Oct 18th – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 217 Ward 5 voters, amongst those decided and leaning, 54% support Frances Nunziata.

"Nunziata has continued to maintain the majority of the vote with the election less than a week away," says Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research.
"." It is highly likely she will get re-elected."

John Tory is also doing well, holding 42% of the vote. Gil Penalosa holds 16%, while 29% are undecided.

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 217 randomly selected eligible voters across York South-Weston. The poll was conducted on October 17thth, 2022. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 7%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample and regional results will be less accurate.
