Call Him Premier Ford

Forum Predicts a Progressive Conservative Majority

Toronto, June 6th – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 2178 Ontario voters, amongst those decided and leaning, 4 in 10 (39%) say they will support the PCs, with a third (34%) saying they will support the NDP, and one-fifth (21%) saying they will support the Liberals.

Few (5%) say they will support either the Green party or (1%) another party.

PC Majority

Doug Ford's PCs will secure 76 seats.

The NDP will serve as official opposition with 39 seats.

The Liberals collapse from a majority government to 9 seats.

"While the NDP surged during the middle of the campaign, their momentum didn't hold, and ultimately the Progressive Conservatives will regain power in Ontario," said Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research. "On June 7th Doug Ford will become premier, marking the end of a decade and a half of Liberal government."

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Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 2178 randomly selected Ontario Voters. The poll was conducted June 6, 2018.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 2%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities. Actual results depend on the parties' ability to get their voters out. Forum houses its poll results in the Data Library of the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto.
