Forum Poll™ accurately predicts Alberta election

Forum calls NDP majority first

TORONTO, MAY 12th, 2015 – In a field of eight polling firms, the Forum Poll™ was fourth most accurate in predicting the outcome of the Alberta provincial election of May 5, 2015. Forum's Interactive Voice Response (IVR) polling methodology again proves to be a precise tool for measuring public opinion, accurately predicting that the NDP would form a majority government. This prediction was first made on April 22.

The Forum Poll predicted a finish of 45% for the NDP (actual share – 41%), 23% for PC (actual share – 28%), and 23% for Wildrose (actual share – 24%), predicting results with an average deviation of 2.0. Overall, it was another accurate prediction by Forum's IVR methodology within the calculated margin of error (+/-3%).

An unexpected result at the last Alberta election in 2012 led to criticism of polling firms for their methodologies; Forum's accuracy in this election has proved once again that IVR is an appropriate, accurate and widely accepted means of measuring public opinion.
