### Peter Mansbridge biggest name in Canadian broadcasting

### **Lloyd Robertson second**

TORONTO AUGUST 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014 – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1798 Canadian adults, the plurality, 3-in-10 cite CBC news anchor Peter Mansbridge (31%) as the "biggest name in Canadian broadcasting", and he is followed by the one-time perennial winner of this poll, retired CTV news anchor Lloyd Robertson (14%), with The Nature Of Things host David Suzuki in the same tier (13%). One tenth cite Hockey Night in Canada commentator Don Cherry in this regard (10%). Fewer opt for comedian Rick Mercer (8%), CTV's current anchor, Lisa Laflamme (6%), Sun News contributor Ezra Levant (3%) or Power & Politics host Evan Solomon (2%). One seventh say someone else is the biggest name in broadcasting (14%). Ideology prevails when preference is measured; Conservative voters are much more likely to cite Ezra Levant (9%) than Liberals or New Democrats (0), while New Democrats (15%) and Liberals (16%) are more likely to mention David Suzuki than Conservatives (3%). Don Cherry is especially popular in the prairies (19%), while David Suzuki is tops in Quebec (27% - no Francophone personalities were listed). Lloyd Robertson is especially well-remembered in Alberta (28%).

"It is fitting that, with Lloyd's retirement, Peter should don the laurels of the dean of Canadian broadcasting. As this is a random poll, and not an online beauty contest, our results accurately reflect the sentiments of the Canadian audience," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

### Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1798 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age and older. The poll was conducted on August 18-19<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate ±2%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities. Forum houses its poll results in the Data Library of the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto.
