## **Moise Maintains Moderate Lead in Toronto Centre**

Moise holds 41% of support, Ward tailing at 26%

Toronto, Sept 15<sup>th</sup> – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 90 Ward 13 voters, amongst those decided and leaning, 41% are voting for Chris Moise and 26% for Nicki Ward.

"Right now, Moise has a fair lead," says Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research. "Though not extremely likely, there is a chance that Ward could catch up in these coming weeks."

John Tory is in the lead despite holding only 26% of support. 63% are undecided.

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 217 randomly selected eligible voters across Toronto Centre. The poll was conducted on Sept 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 7%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample and regional results will be less accurate.
