### Malik Maintains Lead in Spadina-Fort York

With 52% of support, Malik's future looks promising

Toronto, Sept 15<sup>th</sup> – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 208 Ward 10 voters, amongst those decided and leaning, 52% are voting for Ausma Malik. Runners up is Karlene Nation with 13% of support.

"With a slight majority of support, it is very likely that Ausma Malik will take the win this October," says Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research.

John Tory holds a slight lead in the polls, with 30% of support. Gil Penalosa tails behind him at 18%.

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 208 randomly selected eligible voters across Spadina-Fort York. The poll was conducted on Sept 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 7%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample and regional results will be less accurate.
