**The Environment Still a Key Issue for Quebecers**  
**Quebecers Divided on Whether Canada Better or Worse than Four Years Ago**

Toronto, September 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019 – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 1219 Quebecers, half (53%) say that they think Canada is doing better than four years ago, with one sixth (15%) saying that it's doing much better.

Half (47%) also say that it's doing worse, with one fifth (22%) saying it's doing much worse.

**The Environment is the Key Issue for Quebecers in the Upcoming Federal Election**

Quebecers identify the environment as the leading issue, with a third (32%) saying the environment is the most important issue to them in the upcoming federal election.

For a quarter (22%) of Quebecers, the economy is the most important issue, followed by healthcare, with 1 in 6 (16%) saying it is a concern.

Education is the most important issue for 1 in 10 (9%), while a similar proportion say it's immigration (7%).

1 in 20 (6%) say it's taxes.

Few say it's housing (2%), public safety (2%), or something else (4%).

Respondents most likely to identify the environment as the leading issue include those aged 34 and younger (48%), females (37%), QS voters (62%), Federal Green voters (73%), and earning \$20-40k (33%) or the most wealthy (34%).

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## **Quebecers say Education and Healthcare are the Second Most Important Issue to Them**

Healthcare (18%) and Education (18%) are the top issues identified as second most important, followed closely by the economy (14%), the environment (13%), and no second issue (14%).

1 in 10 (9%) say it's taxes or immigration (7%).

Few (4%) say it's public safety, housing (3%), or something else (1%).

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## Methodology

The Forum Poll™ was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1219 randomly selected Quebecers. The poll was conducted from August 27-28, 2019.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20, measured as the average deviation across all response categories. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at [www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp](http://www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp)

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities. Forum houses its poll results in the Data Library of the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto.
