Crisanti Holds Majority Vote in Ward 1

Vincent Crisanti's support is growing in Etobicoke North

Toronto, Oct 18th – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 211 Ward 1 voters, amongst those decided and leaning, 53% support Vincent Crisanti.

John Genser's support has increased in the last couple of weeks, taking second place with 12% of the vote. Avtar Minhas isn't far behind, holding 10% of the vote, and Charles Ozzoude with 9%.

"The Crisanti campaign is doing very well," said Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research. "It's very likely we will see Crisanti take the win, possibly even with a majority."

John Tory's support has also increased, comfortably holding 62% of the vote. Far behind in second place is Gil Penalosa, with 8% of support.

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 211 randomly selected eligible voters across Etobicoke North. The poll was conducted on October 17th, 2022. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/-7%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample and regional results will be less accurate.
