Majority concerned refugees will get preferential immigration treatment

Concern highest among Conservative voters

TORONTO December 8th, 2015 - In a random sampling of public opinion taken by the Forum Poll™ among 1369 Canadian voters, more than half are concerned Syrian refugees invited to Canada will get preferential treatment in the immigration queue (54%), and one third are "very" concerned (34%).

A higher level of concern is characteristic of the mid aged (45 to 54 - 60%), the least wealthy (63%), in Alberta (69%) and among Conservative voters (80%) and among the least educated (66%), but not among the best educated (post grad - 37%).

"Canadians are compassionate, but also strictly fair, and we hate queue jumpers. There is a sense that these refugees are getting into Canada ahead of some other groups who may have been waiting as long, and that has an effect," said Forum Research President, Dr. Lorne Bozinoff.

Methodology

The Forum Poll[™] was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 1369 randomly selected Canadians 18 years of age or older. The poll was conducted between December 6^{th} and 8^{th} , 2015.

Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 3%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample results will be less accurate. Margins of error for subsample (such as age, gender) results are available at www.forumresearch.com/samplestim.asp

Where appropriate, the data has been statistically weighted by age, region, and other variables to ensure that the sample reflects the actual population according to the latest Census data.

This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather, captures opinion at one point in time. Forum Research conducted this poll as a public service and to demonstrate our survey research capabilities.
