Cost of Living & Inflation Voted #1 Issue in Toronto

Housing affordability voted second, crime and gun violence third

Toronto, Oct 20^{th –} In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ amongst 2,994 voters across 14 different wards in Toronto, the cost of living was cited as the biggest issue, with 22% of voters citing it as their number one issue out of 10 options.

Housing affordability ranked number two at 17%, followed by crime and gun violence at 14%.

"The cost of living and inflation is now the top issue for Torontonians," says Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research. "The economy took a big hit during COVID-19, and it appears to be affecting many people."

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 2,994 randomly selected eligible voters across 14 different wards. The poll was conducted on Oct 17th – 19th, 2022. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/-1%, 19 times out of 20. Subsample and regional results will be less accurate. This research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes, but rather captures opinion at one point in time. The poll was sponsored by Forum Research Inc. as a public service.
